

BAY BEACH AMUSEMENT PARK

I-43 Exit 187, north on Webster Av. to Irwin, turn left on Irwin to park entrance

Admission is FREE

Tickets: Ride tickets cost 25 cents each. Rides require 1, 2 or 4 tickets.
Pony ride tickets are \$2.00 and can be purchased next to the ponies.

Zippin Pippin: In 2011 the new roller coaster, Zippin Pippin was erected at Bay Beach and has been a crowd favorite.



Gift Packs: Ride ticket gift packs are now available. Great for birthday gifts, reward incentives, stocking stuffers and special occasion gifts.

The Sanctuary is a unique 700-acre urban wildlife refuge that supports a free flying flock of native ducks and geese. Corn is sold to feed the waterfowl. Nesting bald eagles, egrets, herons and other birds can be observed.

The Nature Education Center offers many hands-on educational exhibits for people of all ages: the Habitat House, Habitat Hollow, and crawl through Habitat Hole. Also located in the Nature Education Center is the Stop-N-Gander gift shop, which offers a variety of unique nature gifts and souvenirs. Refreshments are provided by vending machines on the lower level.

The Floating Boardwalk was constructed as a unique "walk-on water" experience for the public, as a short cut, connecting the Nature Center to the Observation Building area. This low profile water bridge gives the feeling of walking on water, brings visitors close to feed the ducks and geese and provides a panoramic view of the ReschFalls and the surrounding lagoons.

The Resch Conservation Wing is the place to visit for watching waterfowl, seeing live song and shorebirds and having the chance to touch live animals at the Critter Counter. A nursery viewing window, animal care facilities, and corn are all available at this building along with 15 bird of prey exhibits.

The ReschFalls dedicated in the summer of 2010, rises 25 feet above the lagoon surface. Over 3,500 gallons of water per minute cascades off of the massive dolomite stone ledges. The falls, the final piece of a 3 year lagoon restoration project undertaken by the Friends of the Wildlife Sanctuary, was designed to circulate the water between a number of lagoons, add oxygen and create a spectacular "natural" feature. The accessible Kress Family Nature Trail meanders through a tunnel and to numerous look out vistas. Rest benches, topography with trees and shrubs, butterfly and songbird flower beds complete the landscape.

The Woodland Building houses indoor nocturnal animal exhibits. Flying squirrels, owls, mink and various other nighttime creatures can be seen in their darkened environment.

Wolves can be viewed in their acre habitat from inside the Woodland Building or from the trails outside. Cougar, fox, otters and bobcat are also on exhibit outside.



Down the trail from the Woodland Building is the coyote and porcupine exhibit and walk-in deer habitat with a 30-foot viewing tower. The 6.2-mile long nature trail system continues on and meanders through forest, field and marsh providing the opportunity to view a wide variety of native plants and animals. The trail connects with the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay Cofrin Arboretum trail system offering a total of 12 miles of hiking, and in winter, cross-country skiing.

The Environmental Education Program serves schools, organizations and the general public with nature programs for all ages. Most programs have a nominal fee and need to be set up in advance. Call for further information.

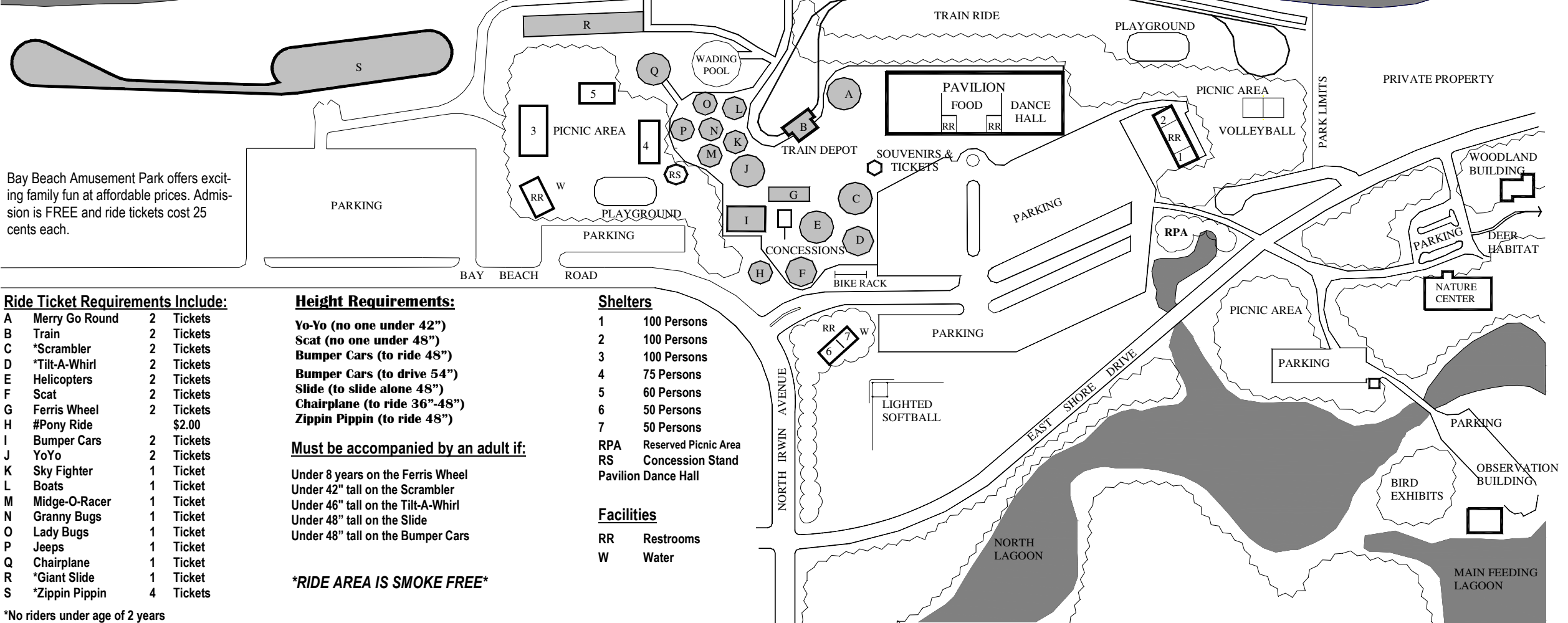
